

Wednesday Night PRAYER SERVICE

DOCTRINE OF GLORIFICATION

1. Glorification- Glorification is God's final removal of sin from the life of the saints in the eternal state.

2. The Glorification of Christ in connection with our glorification.

Romans 8:29-30 "For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn among many brothers. And those whom he predestined he also called, and those whom he called he also justified, and those whom he justified he also glorified."

3. The Glorification of the Soul

A) Full and final vindication for the believer.

Romans 5:9-10 "Since, therefore, we have now been justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God. For if while we were enemies we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, now that we are reconciled, shall we be saved by his life."

- B) The believer will be perfected morally and spiritually. Colossians 1:22 "He has now reconciled in his body of flesh by his death, in order to present you holy and blameless and above reproach before him."
- C) The believer will experience the fullness of knowledge. 1 Corinthians 13:12 "For now we see in a mirror dimly, but then face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I have been fully known."
- D) The Believer will see Jesus.

 1 John 3:2 "Beloved, we are God's children now, and

what we will be has not yet appeared; but we know that when he appears we shall be like him, because we shall see him as he is."

4. The Glorification of the body.

Philippians 3:20-21 "But our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, who will transform our lowly body to be like his glorious body, by the power that enables him even to subject all things to himself."

A) The Glorification of the body will take place at the Second Coming of Christ (Instantaneously).

1 Corinthians 15:51-53 "Behold! I tell you a mystery. We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed, in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised imperishable, and we shall be changed. For this perishable body must put on the imperishable, and this mortal body must put on immortality."

- B) 1 Corinthians 15:38-50 contrasts our earthly bodies and our resurrected bodies.
 - The present body is perishable- the resurrected body is immune to decay and disease.
 - The present body is seeded in dishonor/ disgrace- the resurrected body will be glorious.
 - The present body is weak- the resurrected body is powerful.
 - The present body is physical- the resurrected body will be spiritual.
